Re: Siemens' legal and moral obligations to truth, justice and the people of Malta

Dear Mr Käser,

Repubblika asks Siemens to publicly declare the extent of its knowledge of money laundering and kickbacks involved in the Electrogas deal in Malta and to do its part to have the contracts signed by Electrogas rescinded on the grounds that they were procured by corruption.

Siemens prides itself that "only clean business is Siemens business" where business decisions are based on the Siemens values: "responsible", "excellent" and "innovative".

Siemens' business partner, Yorgen Fenech, stands charged with commissioning the assassination of journalist Daphne Caruana Galizia, who had uncovered a kickback scheme involving public officials from Malta and Azerbaijan with proceeds from the Electrogas project.

Albeit perhaps unintentionally, Siemens has exacerbated Malta's corrupt environment and created an unfair market by assisting the development of a private monopoly shaped by corruption.

Consequently, we ask Siemens for a commitment to truth and justice and to undo the corrupt deal that led to Daphne Caruana Galizia's murder.

We are willing to discuss our request with you.
